She was the widow of Nathaniel Foote and the sister of John Deming. She had seven children from her previous marriage.

Drawing upon cutting-edge research in the field, original work by the author, and essays from leading crime history researchers, it addresses the question of whether there was an Australian underworld. In doing so, it provides background for well known offenders including bushranger Ned Kelly and the razor gangs of the 1920s and for sensational crimes like the Mount Rennie Outrage, the Pyjama Girl Mystery and the Shark Arm Murder and the miscarriage of justice following the disappearance of Azaria Chamberlain at Uluru in 1980. Through these case studies, the book draws out points of tension and cohesion within Australian society, exposing the enduring anxiety around those who were considered to be outsiders, and how the criminal justice system was used to manage these concerns. This book includes a guide to conducting research in the field of Australian crime history and

sources for further study. Designed as an introductory text for students, this book will be of interest to those studying criminology and crime history, and anyone who would like to deepen their understanding of crime's place in Australia's social and cultural history.

Chaplains to the Imprisoned begins to fill the information gap through its in-depth study of prison chaplains as seen by co-workers, inmates, and the chaplains themselves. They describe their roles, share difficulties which are encountered in their ministry, and personal methods for coping with these difficulties, especially those which may be internalized as stress. The author, a Roman Catholic priest with a doctorate in criminal justice, provides a fascinating look into the work of chaplains who serve in correctional institutions. This new book sheds a much-needed light on

the often hidden, yet significant, role played by chaplains within correctional facilities. Little is known of these chaplains and the work that they do. Though they are frequently depicted in television and film, many of these images are stereotypes from writers' imaginations. In this unique book, chaplains speak for themselves through the results of a survey questionnaire sent by the author to local- and state-level chaplains in New York State and to chaplains throughout the federal prison system. Chaplains to the Imprisoned, the first non-denominational book on these clergy, explores: the history of chaplaincy in this country, including the irony that chaplains have often been treated as unwanted intruders in penitentiaries--which were created originally by religious groups chaplains as seen by other professionals in the field--sometimes positive, often negative, opinions of chaplains drawn from literature written by wardens, corrections officers, and others who deal with

Williams present the final
version of Robert Rossen's
screenplay for Jack London's
The Sea Wolf. Released in
1941, this classic film was
directed by Michael Curtiz and
starred Edward G. Robinson as
Wolf Larsen, John Garfield as
George Leach, Ida Lupino as

fugitive Ruth Webster,
Alexander Knox as writer
Humphrey Van Weyden, and
Howard da Silva as Harrison.
Both the novel and the film
feature a hard-luck assemblage
condemned either by savage
coercion or pure evil fortune to
sail aboard the Ghost, a seal-
harvesting vessel commanded
by a power-mad tyrant?the
aptly named Wolf Larsen.
Discussing the process of
turning literature into film,
Fumento and Williams analyze
in detail the differences
between London's Sea Wolf and
Rossen's screenplay. Re-
creating the world into which
the movie emerged, each editor
provides a separate
introduction. Fumento analyzes
the role of Warner Brothers in
determining relevant
production and allegorical
features of the final film
version. Williams describes
London's reasons for writing the
original novel in 1903, its
appeal for the cinema, the
different film versions?at least
eight-that have appeared, and
the social and historical context
influencing Rossen's

screenplay.

From Bulkeley to Bulkley to Buckley - Thomas Taylor

Drawing from a wide range of sources, this work is a continuation of one line of the Bulkeley family, focusing on the ancestors and descendants of Moses Bulkley (1727-1812) last presented in *The Bulkeley Genealogy* by Donald Lines Jacobus in 1933. The relationship between the earliest American ancestors on this line, Reverend Peter Bulkeley and Reverend John Jones, founders of the First Parish Church in Concord, Massachusetts in 1636, is re-examined. New evidence revealing critical errors made by Concord historians since 1835 will re-characterize the essential clerical friendship the two men shared and show the true reasons for John Jones's removal to Fairfield, Connecticut in 1644. Using census records, rare newspaper articles, obituaries, wills, surrogate court records, and family stories, this line of the Bulkeleys of Concord and Fairfield is chronicled in a new family history covering the mid-18th century to the present. The

Bulkeley/Bulkley/Buckley genealogy is supplemented with genealogies of several families these Bulkeley/Bulkley/Buckleys married with in the 19th and 20th centuries. This work evolved into a "search and rescue mission," and offers a comprehensive on-paper reunion of families that have been documented to the beginning of the 20th century, and a few who have never been documented in a genealogy.
